"To one who knows the right thing to do and does it not, to him it is sin." James 4:17

A young woman in Scotland decided that the next right thing for her to do was to teach a Sunday School class for underprivileged boys. Each boy was given a new set of clothes to wear to church. After a few weeks, a boy named Bob quit coming. So the teacher went to see him and found that he had ruined his new suit. So she arranged for him to get a second suit, and he came back to class - for a while - but then he dropped off the radar again.

The teacher found out that he had ruined the second suit also. She told the church superintendent, "I'm completely discouraged about Bob. I guess we should just give up on him." But the superintendent said, "Let's give it a try one more time." So they gave Bob a third suit, and he returned to class.

This time he stayed, and eventually he accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior. That boy was Robert Morrison, who became the first Protestant missionary to China and the first to translate the Bible into Chinese. The Word of God was made available to millions of people because that Sunday School teacher and that superintendent were ready to do the next right thing, even when they didn't know the outcome.

That's why the Apostle Paul said in Galatians 6:9, "Let us not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we will reap if we do not grow weary."

Why do stars appear to twinkle? Try this experiment to find out!

What you need:

- Aluminum foil
- Large glass bowl



What you do:

- Crumple the foil into a ball.
 Carefully unfold it and lay it flat on the ground.
- 2. Fill the bowl with water and place it on the foil.
- Turn off the lights and make the room as dark as possible. Shine the flashlight about 1 foot from the water's undisturbed surface. Light will reflect onto the foil.
- 4. Then tap your finger on the water's surface. As the water moves, what happens to the light on the foil?
- This flickering simulates scintillation, which happens when starlight enters Earth's atmosphere. As light passes through layers of gas and water, it refracts and appears to twinkle.



2024 SENIOR FARMERS MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM

We have received information regarding this program from the York County Area Agency on Aging. It provides FREE \$50 in vouchers to eligible seniors to buy fresh fruit and vegetables from participating farmer's markets throughout Pennsylvania.

Eligibility requirements are:

- Must be 60 yrs of age or older by December 31, 2024
- Must be a York County resident
- Cannot live in a nursing, personal care, or other residential facility where meals are provided
- 2024 Gross annual household income must be at or below: \$27,861 for an individual OR \$37,814 for a 2 person household OR \$47,767 for a 3 person household (Each eligible person may receive a voucher if eligible)
